

## Program Description

The CPMP was established by the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to allow eligible inmate pregnant women and inmate mothers the opportunity to be housed with their children in a supervised facility away from the prison setting. The primary focus of the CPMP is to reunite mothers with their child(ren) and re-integrate them back into society as productive citizens by (a) providing a safe, stable, wholesome and stimulating environment, (b) establishing stability in the parent-child relationship, and providing the opportunity for inmate mothers to bond with their children and strengthen the family unit. Specific goals are:

- (1) To **PROMOTE** community reintegration, independent living and self-reliance;
- (2) To **REDUCE** the use of alcohol and drugs, involvement in criminal behavior, the rate of recidivism, Factors which result in trauma to children of incarcerated parents and ultimately long-term costs to the state;
- (3) To **INCREASE** parenting skills, emotional stability, and educational and vocational opportunities;
- (4) To **ADDRESS** substance abuse issues, behavioral and psychological factors which impact emotional stability, self esteem, self-reliance, parent-child relationship and appropriate child development;
- (5) To **PROVIDE** pre-release planning, employment skills, educational, vocational and parenting skills.

## Who we serve

Located in a college-like setting, Prototypes' Pomona campus is equipped to provide treatment and housing for women and children. Our dormitory style living provides separate living quarters for women with children and for pregnant women. The clients who come to Prototypes are women age 18 and older whose lives have been disrupted by trauma, drug and/or alcohol addiction, domestic violence, mental health conditions, complex medical conditions, anger management problems and even homelessness. Our staff can assist you or your loved one in navigating the complex criminal justice system. Many of our clients are also mothers, or expectant mothers, who want to keep their babies and young children with them while they undergo treatment in residence. We totally agree and welcome them, too.

Staff include some of the most dedicated, experienced, highly trained professionals in the field – certified substance abuse counselors, licensed mental health clinicians, psychiatrists, job development counselors, housing specialists and parenting specialists.

## What we offer

Everything we do – from therapy to life skills education to vocational training and beyond – is designed to maximize a woman's chances for a healthy, self-sustaining life. We offer:

- Individualized treatment and assessment
- Individual and group counseling
- Head Start and Early Head Start
- Psychiatric evaluation and treatment
- Medication assisted therapies
- Specialized services for women involved in the criminal justice system
- Vocational and educational rehabilitation, including onsite GED classes and college courses
- Parenting skills classes
- Family counseling
- Aftercare
- Family accommodation, along with intensive services for children
- Treatment designed for women that is Trauma-informed, Gender-responsive, & Evidence-based
- Treatment for co-occurring substance use and mental health disorders so that multiple issues can be addressed in a single treatment program
- Recreational activities and other support services as needed

*All treatment plans are highly individualized, and the length and intensity of treatment is based on those individual needs.*

## Eligibility Requirements

- Pregnant or have legal custody of a biological child under six years old.
- Eligible for Minimum Support Facility placement with a classification score of 35 points or less.
- No more than 6 years but at least 90 days to release.
