37mm/40mm Caliber Launcher - (No more 37mm) A rifled bore launcher, capable of firing direct/indirect impact munition rounds and chemical agents.

37mm Multi-Launcher - No longer authorized for use

Actual Possession - Exists when a person has physical custody or control of an object.

ADA Appeals – An appeal of issues related with medical appliances and other types of Americans with Disability Act related issues.

Adjudicated – A formal judgment or decision of the guilt or innocence of an inmate based on the preponderance of evidence evaluated by the hearing official.

Administrative RVR – Prepared for conduct of a minor nature as outlined in California Code of Regulations, Title 15 Section 3314.

Advisement – Appeals submitted by certain inmates must receive careful consideration before acceptance and processing of the appeal can begin.

Aggravated Battery - Every person confined in the state prison who commits a battery by gassing upon the person of any peace officer, as defined in Chapter 4.5 (commencing with Section 830) of Title 3 of Part 2, or employee of the state prison is guilty of aggravated battery and shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail or by imprisonment in the state prison for two, three, or four years.

Assault – Any unlawful attempt, coupled with a present ability, to commit a violent injury on the person of another.

Attempted Escape - An unsuccessful effort to breach a secured perimeter or the use of force against a person to attempt access into an unauthorized area. Some progress toward implementing an escape must be made to implement a plan. This includes, but is not limited to the following overt acts: acquiring unauthorized clothing or identification, preparing a hiding place in an unauthorized area, lying in wait for a potential hostage, attempting access to a perimeter that was unsupervised, unlawfully obtaining tools to aid in an escape, manufacturing a likeness of a person in order to substitute for the inmate's presence, or receiving assistance from other conspirators who acted upon an escape plan, e.g. a plan to escape uncovered from verbal, telephone or mail communication.

Attempted Homicide - Any attempt to kill a human being with malice aforethought.

Attempted Suicide - Non-fatal, self-directed, potentially injurious behavior with the intent to die as a result of the behavior; may not result in injury.

Baton - Hand held expandable baton (Manadnock).

DIVISION OF ADULT INSTITUTIONS GLOSSARY



Battery – Unlawful and willful act of force or violence upon the person of another.

Cancelled – An appeal that the appeals coordinator or third level Appeals Chief has returned to the inmate without a response to the specific appeal issues and is considered closed with the inmate having not exhausted administrative remedies.

Case Records Appeal – An appeal of issues associated with an inmate's record such as release date calculation and gang affiliation.

Classification Appeal – An appeal of a classification committee action which can include affixing a suffix, assessment of an administrative determinate, transfer to another facility, prison, or program.

Civilian Arrest - Any arrest of a civilian/non-employee.

CN - Chemical agent Chloroacetoephene - Color Code Red.

Conduct – The manner in which a person behaves.

Constructive Possession – Exists where a person has knowledge of an object and control of the object or the right to control the object, even if the person has no physical contact with it.

Controlled Extraction - Refer to Controlled Use of Force definition.

Controlled Possession – Refer to Possession.

Controlled Use of Force - The force used in an institution/facility setting, when an inmate's presence or conduct poses a threat to safety or security and the inmate is located in an area that can be controlled or isolated.

Controlled Substance – Any substance, drug, narcotic, opiate, hallucinogen, depressant or stimulant as defined by Health and Safety Code Section 11007. Also included are prescribed medications containing any of the substances identified in Health and Safety Code Section 11007.

Counseling RVR – Report that is prepared when similar minor misconduct recurs after verbal counseling or if documentation of minor misconduct is needed, a description of the misconduct and counseling provided is included in the report.

CS - Chemical agent Orthochlorobenzalmalononitrile - Color Code Blue.

CSW - The objective of placing an inmate on Contraband Surveillance Watch (CSW) is to retrieve concealed contraband without physical intrusion if possible; ensure that contraband is not circulated into the inmate population; and ensure the safety of the inmate suspected of having the concealed contraband.

Custody Appeal – An appeal of issues related to degree of custody, work groups, policies and procedures, and other types of custody issues.

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Deadly Weapon – Any weapon identified in Penal Code Section 4502. Any item or substance not readily identified as a weapon becomes a deadly weapon when used in a manner that could reasonably result in serious bodily injury or death.

Deceased – The inmate has died before the time limits for responding to the appeal have expired.

Defaced – The contamination of an appeal using food, white out, tape, hair, blood, bodily fluids, excrement or attaching clothing, razor blades, string, books, or magazines.

Delaying – To cause a peace officer to be late or causing a distraction in order to delay a peace officer from his or her duties.

Denied – The inmate has no right to compensation or remedy for the issue included in the appeal.

Disciplinary Appeal – An appeal of an administrative or serious Rules Violation Report (RVR) and other disciplinary issues.

Disposition – Any Penalty assessed when found guilty of all charges identified in the Rules Violation Report.

Disturbance – A breakdown of peaceful and law-abiding behavior.

Documented Use of Force - Every staff use of force is an incident that shall be reported. Uses of force includes non-deadly force, immediate force, controlled force and non-conventional force. Any employee who uses force or observed a staff use force shall report it to a supervisor as soon as practical and follow up with appropriate documentation prior to being relieved from duty.

Drug Paraphernalia – Any device, contrivance, instrument, or paraphernalia intended to be used for unlawfully injecting or consuming into the human body a controlled substance as identified in Health and Safety Code Section 11007.

Duplicate Appeal – An appeal that is the same as a previous appeal filed by the inmate upon which a decision has been rendered or is pending.

Escape - Every prisoner confined in a state prison who, by force or violence, escapes or attempts to escape therefrom and every prisoner committed to a state prison who, by force or violence, escapes or attempts to escape while being conveyed to or from that prison or any other state prison, or any prison road camp, prison forestry camp, or other prison camp or prison farm or any other place while under the custody of prison officials, officers or employees; or who, by force or violence, escapes or attempts to escape from any prison road camp, prison forestry camp, or other prison camp or prison farm or other place while under the custody of prison officials, officers or employees; or who, by force or violence, escapes or attempts to escape while at work outside or away from prison under custody of prison officials, officers, or employees, is punishable by imprisonment in the state prison for a term of two, four, or six years. The second term of imprisonment of a person convicted under this subdivision shall commence from the time he or she would otherwise have been discharged from prison. No additional probation report shall be required with respect to that offense.

Expected Death - An inmate who has been placed at a level of care anticipating death in the near future (hospice).

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Explosive Device – A device that can burst with sudden violence from internal energy.

Fighting – Displaying or engaging in violence, combat, or aggression.

For Effect - The firing of the Mini-14 (deadly force) or 40mm Launcher (less lethal force), with the intent of hitting the subject. Warning shots are not considered shooting for effect.

Fund Appeal – An appeal of issues associated with restitution, gate money, deposits, canteen draws, and other types of inmate funds.

Granted – The inmate will receive all requested compensation or remedy for the issue included in the appeal.

Granted in Part – The inmate will receive part of the requested compensation or remedy for the issue included in the appeal.

Homicide - The deliberate and unlawful killing of one person by another; murder.

IEX - Refer to Indecent Exposure

Illegible - The appeal is not printed legibly in ink or was typed in a font smaller than 12-point or otherwise making the appeal unreadable to the appeal coordinator.

Immediate Extraction - Involves the imminent threat to loss of life or imminent threat to institution security. An emergency that exists requiring the immediate removal of the inmate from the cell.

In Cell - An incident involving assaultive/sexually assaultive behavior towards a cellmate inside their cell.

Inactive Monitored – A validated gang affiliate who was released from the Security Housing Unit concurrent with the implementation of the Step Down Program through a Departmental Review Board hearing.

Indecent Exposure – Every person who willfully and lewdly, either exposes his or her person, or the private parts thereof, in any public place, or in any place where there are present other persons to be offended or annoyed thereby; or procures, counsels, or assists any person so to expose him or her self or take part in any model artist exhibition, or to make any other exhibition of him or her self to public view, or the view of any number of persons, such as is offensive to decency, or is adapted to excite to vicious or level thoughts or acts.

Intoxicant – Toluene or any bi-product i.e. paint thinners, paint, fingernail polish, lacquers, gasoline, kerosene, adhesives or other substance that markedly diminishes physical and/or mental control.

L8 - No longer authorized for use

Legal Appeal – An appeal of access to court, mishandling of legal work, processing of appeals, notary services and other types of legal issues.

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Living Condition Appeal – An appeal of safety, sanitation, clothing, food services, telephone calls, housing assignment and other types of living condition issues.

Lockdown - The restriction of all inmates, in a dorm/building/facility, to their cells/dormitory beds.

Mail Appeal – An appeal of a disallowed/disapproved magazine, publication, package, and other item that is shipped through the mail.

Mental Health Level of Care - The Mental Health Services Delivery System Level of Care as determined by a licensed mental health clinician (CCCMS, MHCB, EOP, DMH).

Mini 14 - A .223 Caliber, semi-automatic, gas operated, shoulder fired weapon. It is CDCR's primary weapon, and used in gun towers, gun walks, observation posts, and other areas where deadly force may be necessary.

Modification Order – An order by the institution, parole region, or third level Appeals Chief directing a previous decision to be modified.

Modified Program - The suspension or restriction of less than all inmate program activities and/or movement.

Murder – The unlawful killing of a human being or a fetus with malice aforethought.

Non-Conventional Force - Force that utilizes techniques or instruments that are not specifically authorized in policy, procedures, or training.

Non-Prisoner – Any person that is not an inmate or a peace officer.

Obstructing – Impede or prevent a peace officer from performing his or her duties.

OC - Chemical agent Oleoresin Capsicum - Color Code Orange.

Out of Jurisdiction – An issue that cannot legally be decided by the Department.

Personal Property Appeal – An appeal of lost, stolen, or damaged property that occurred during a cell search, placement in segregated housing, or during transport to another institution or other location.

Physical Force - Any deliberate physical contact, using any part of the body to overcome conscious resistance.

Possession – Actual possession exists when a person has physical custody or control of an object.

Program Appeal – An appeal of drug testing, substance abuse programs, in cell study programs, religious services, yard scheduling and other types of programs.

Reasonable Force

Reasonable force is the force that an objective, trained, and competent correctional employee faced with similar facts and circumstances, would consider necessary and reasonable to subdue an attacker, overcome resistance, effect custody, or gain compliance with a lawful order.

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Reentry Appeal – An appeal of placement in specific reentry locations or programs.

Reportable Incidents - Examples of incidents which shall be reported: All felonies committed by inmates, parolees, employees or the public on institution property, during transportation or under the jurisdiction of parole regions. General or partial lockdowns. Riots, inmate strikes or general demonstrations. Major power failures. Serious accidents or injuries. Deaths. Significant damage or destruction of state property. Escapes or attempted escapes. Any state of emergency as described in CCR 3383. Any use or discharge of weapons, chemical agents or tasers. Threats against the President or Vice-President of the United States, or threats against state officials. Safety grievances (employees). Employee job actions. Sexual Violence Allegations.

Resisting – A willful and unlawful attempt, by means of any threat or violence, to deter or prevent an executive officer from performing his or her lawful duty.

Riot – (CA Penal Code) When two or more people acting together do any of the following without authority of law:

1. Use force or violence;
2. Disturb the public peace, or
3. Threaten to use force or violence with immediate power to execute the threat.

Rout – A disturbance of the peace by persons assembled together with intent to do something, which if executed would become a riot.

Rules Violation Report (RVR) – Report that documents inmate behavior that is a violation of law, California Code of Regulations Title 15, and/or approved procedure.

Screen Out – An appeal that is sent back to the inmate unprocessed due to cancellation, rejection, or withdrawal in accordance with Title 15 Section 3084.6.

Security Threat Group (STG) – Any ongoing formal or informal organization, association, or group of three or more persons which has a common name or identifying sign or symbol whose members and/or associates, individually or collectively, engage or have engaged, on behalf of that organization, association or group, in two or more acts which include, planning, organizing, threatening, financing, soliciting or committing unlawful acts, or acts of misconduct.

Sedatives - A drug taken for its calming or sleep-inducing effect.

Segregation Hearings Appeal – An appeal of placement in Administrative Segregation, Security Housing Unit placement, and other segregated housing issues.

Seizure - Confiscation of unauthorized possession or constructive possession of contraband.

Serious Bodily Injury (SBI) - A serious impairment of physical condition, including, but not limited to the following: loss of consciousness; bone fracture; protracted loss or impairment of function of any bodily member or organ; a wound requiring extensive suturing; and serious disfigurement.

Serious RVR – Prepared when inmate misconduct is a felony, misdemeanor, or deemed serious by regulation.

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Sexual Disorderly Conduct – Every person who touches, without exposing, his or her genitals, buttocks or breasts in a manner that demonstrates it is for the purpose of sexual arousal, gratification, annoyance, or offense, and that any reasonable person would consider this conduct offensive.

Sexual Misconduct

Any behavior of a sexual nature between an inmate and a visitor including, but not limited to: Sexual intercourse, oral copulation, or masturbation. The rubbing or touching of breast(s) or sexual organ(s) for the purpose of arousing, appealing to, or gratifying lust, passions, or sexual desires. Exposure of breast(s), buttocks or sexual organ(s) for the purpose of arousing, appealing to, or gratifying lust, passions, or sexual desires.

Staff Complaint Appeal – Issue related to staff behavior that violates or is contrary to law, regulation, policy, procedure, or an ethical or professional standard.

STG-I – Term used to identify and prioritize the level of threat the group presents that affects the safety and security of the institution and public safety. STG-I designation will be reserved for STGs that pose the greatest of these threats. STG-I designation will include, but may not be limited to, traditional prison gangs, or similar disruptive groups or gangs that the department has certified to have a history and propensity for violence and/or influence over subservient STGs.

STG-II – Term used to identify and prioritize the level of threat the group presents that affects the safety and security of the institution and public safety. The STG-II designation may include, but is not limited to, traditional disruptive groups/street gangs.

Stimulant – A substance that raises levels of physiological or nervous activity in the body.

Strike – A refusal to institution/departmental policy organized by a group of people or inmates as a form of protest, typically in an attempt to gain a concession or concessions from the institution/department.

Suicide - The act or an instance of taking one's own life voluntarily and intentionally.

Threatening - A verbal or written threat or a threat implied by a pattern of conduct or a combination of verbal or written statements and conduct made with the intent and the apparent ability to carry out the threat so as to cause the person who is the target of the threat to reasonably fear for his or her safety or the safety of his or her immediate family.

Transfer Appeal – An appeal of a decision to transfer the inmate to another institution or facility.

Uncontrolled Possession - The discovery of contraband in a common area where no possession can be established to any individual(s) also known as a "Common Area Find".

Unexpected Death - Occurs suddenly and earlier than anticipated.

Unlawful Assembly – A group of people with the mutual intent of deliberate disturbance of the peace.

Urinalysis – Analysis of urine by physical, chemical, and microscopic means to test for the presence of drugs.

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Use of Force - DOM 51020.1 It is the policy of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation's (CDCR), Division of Adult Institutions (DAI), to accomplish custodial and correctional functions with minimal reliance on the use of force. Employees may use reasonable force as required in the performance of their duties, but shall not use unnecessary or excessive force. Staff may, at any point, determine the situation can be resolved without the use of force and terminate the use of force process.

This policy, in conjunction with related procedures and training, defines staff responsibilities and requirements concerning the use of force.

This policy will assist staff in identifying when and how much force is appropriate under different circumstances, ensure that supervision, monitoring, and evaluation of the use of force is consistent with procedures and training, and ensure the investigation of possible unnecessary or excessive use of force. Staff found culpable of violations of the Use of Force Policy will be subject to disciplinary (preventive, corrective, or adverse action) procedures.

Validated – The formal and objective process for identifying and documenting Security Threat Group (STG) affiliates.

Visiting - These regulations are made in recognition and consideration of the value of inmate visitation as a means of increasing safety in prisons, maintaining family and community connections, and preparing inmates for successful release and rehabilitation. It is the intent of these regulations to establish a visiting process in the institutions/facilities of the department that is conducted in as accommodating a manner as possible, subject to the need to maintain order, the safety of persons, the security of the institution/facility, and required prison activities and operations. Each institution/facility shall provide visiting for no less than 12 hours per week. Any reduction of an institution/facility visiting schedule below 12 hours shall require the prior approval of the Secretary or designee. Regular visiting days shall be consecutive and include Saturday and Sunday.

Visiting Appeal – An appeal of family visiting, facility accommodations, minor visiting restrictions, visitor approval, visitor search and other visiting issues.

Wireless Device – Any system or device, as a cellular phone, for transmitting messages or signals by electromagnetic waves.

Withdrawn – The inmate who filed the appeal has requested to stop the appeal process.

Work Incentive Appeal – An appeal of education, vocation, waiting lists, removal from a job, pay grade, credit earning and other types of work incentive issues.

X10 - For removal of objects/barricades from doors or food/security ports, and to introduce OC into the cell.
