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## Residential Multi-Service Center (RMSC)

Residential Multi-Service Centers provide substance use disorder treatment, housing, sustenance, and life skills. The RMSC's primary goal is to end substance abuse among the parolee population, and to help parolees transition into productive members of society. The program targets parolees who are living in at-risk environments. Services include housing, substance use disorder treatment, literacy training, job preparation and placement, anger management classes, and individual and group counseling.

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**Location(s):** RMSCs are located in the following counties:

- Fresno
- Yolo
- Los Angeles (with 2 locations)
- Kern
- San Diego.

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**Length of Program:** The program length is up to 180 days of residence with a 90-day aftercare component. Residential services may be extended for up to one year on a case-by-case basis.

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**Enrollment:** Referral by parolee's Agent of Record (AOR) via CDCR form 1502, Activity Report

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**Eligibility Requirements:** All parolees subject to the jurisdiction of Division of Adult Parole Operations (DAPO) are eligible to participate. Parolee should have an identified Correctional Offender Management Profiling for Alternative Sanctions (COMPAS) need.

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*CDCR's Division of Rehabilitative Programs (DRP) manages adult inmate and parolee rehabilitative programs. Its top priority is to provide rehabilitative programming and life skills to offenders in an effort to reduce their likelihood of reoffending after their release from prison. DRP is comprised of the Office of Offender Services (OS), the Office of Correctional Education (OCE), and the Office of Program Accountability and Support (OPAS).*

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
