WHICH PROGRAM IS BEST FOR YOU?

The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), through the Division of Rehabilitative Programs, administers a statewide network of community-based programs for parolees.

Programs include services focused on:



Community Reentry Services CRS PROGRAMS

SPECIALIZED TREATMENT FOR OPTIMIZED PROGRAMMING (STOP)

STOP Contractors have a goal to provide comprehensive evidence-based programming and services to participants during their transition back into the community. STOP services will be available to individuals who have been released from prison and are under active parole supervision.

DAY REPORTING CENTERS (DRC)

Provides lifeskills, literacy and employment training to help parolees maintain employment.

FEMALE OFFENDER TREATMENT AND EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (FOTEP)

Provides a smooth transition for female offenders from custody to the community; focusing on intensive, gender-responsive, trauma-informed services. It also gives the women the opportunity to have their children reside with them as they progress through their residential treatment and recovery for up to 15 months.

PAROLEE SERVICE CENTER (PSC)

Provides residency and support services to parolees to enable successful reintegration into their communities.

RESIDENTIAL MULTI-SERVICE CENTER (RMSC)

Provides substance abuse treatment, housing, and life skills.

GOLDEN STATE WORKS (GSW) INITIATIVE

GSW's goal is for the parolee to receive employment preparation, transitional employment, and job placement services.

COMPUTER LITERACY LEARNING CENTER (CLLC)

The goal is to achieve significant learning gains in reading, writing, and math skills.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT AND RECOVERY (STAR) PROGRAM

Provide relapse prevention education to parolees with substance abuse treatment needs.
