

ROADMAP TO REHABILITATION

IN-PRISON

- 1 Offender's risks to recidivate and criminogenic needs are assessed.
- 2 Offender meets with their correctional counselor and is placed in appropriate programs and/or education, based on rehabilitative needs.

UP TO 60 MONTHS PRIOR TO RELEASE

- 3 Eligible offenders may be placed in various educational programs, including Career Technical, offered by the Office of Correctional Education.
- 4 Cognitive Behavioral Treatment programs are provided to address substance abuse, anger management, criminal thinking, and family relationships 24 months prior to an offenders release.

CLOSER TO RELEASE

- 5 Offender applies for California Identification card within 8 months of release.
- 6 Eligible offenders enroll in pre-employment and financial literacy programs within 6 months of release.

RIGHT BEFORE RELEASE

- 7 **CTP - Community Transition Program**
Reentry assessment directs offender to appropriate parole programs.
Offenders matriculate at 210 days.

- 8 **MCRP - Male Community Reentry Program**
The MCRP is available to offenders 180 days prior to their release.

- CCTRP - Custody to Community Transitional Reentry Program**
Female participants are placed in the program with a min. of 45 days and a max. of two years prior to their release.

- ACP - Alternative Custody Program**

ON PAROLE

- 9 Parole Agent enrolls and supports parolee progress in the following programs:
 - Substance use disorder treatment
 - Housing, life skills and family unification needs
 - Educational including GED, academic and vocational training
 - Employment and job assistance including placement
- 10 Parolee successfully rejoins society.

- 10 Parolee successfully reintegrates into the community
